Introduction

The project 'Youth Hands in Hands for Combating Drug and Substance Abuse' is a Erasmus+ Structured Dialogue project which coordinates by Beyoğlu District National Education Directorate with the cooperation of Istanbul Governor, Kasımpaşa High school ,Intercultural Club-Goethe Uni, Labour Association, European Youth Centre Breclav, Associação Novo Mundo, Institute for Social Integration, Continuous Action, CET Platform Croatia, and Eughenia Società Cooperativa Sociale.

The general aim of the project is to develop youth policy to combat against drug and substance abuse from the perspective of young people contribution by youth workers, experts and decision makers.

The specific objectives of the project are written below.

- to prepare snapshots of the European drug and substance reports based on the latest available information from EU monitoring activities.
- to have an overview of the legal and regulatory framework that controls the consumption of drugs and substance
- to exchange the experience on preventing drug and substance consumption
- to develop capacity and cooperation among the partner organisations to fight against drug and substance abuse

The project contains four main activities which are two national meetings and two transnational meetings.

National Meetings

Activity 1: Launching meeting: Only national partners and young people from local communities participated in this activity. This activity is already implemented in 16th of May 2018.

Activity 4: Dissemination Event: Only national partners and young people from local communities will participate in this activity.

Transnational Meetings

Activity 2: Youth Hands in Hands Youth Workers, Expert and Decision Makers Meeting: Experts and decision makers will be gathered at Goethe University, Frankfurt, Germany. Each partner will send 2 representatives except Germany and Turkey. (Frankfurt, Germany, 13-18 October 2018)

Activity 3: Youth Hands in Hands Expert-Decision Makers Speeches and Report Workshop: Each partner sends 4 young people. (Istanbul, Turkey, end of November. The exact date will be discussed with the partners)

Description of activity

"A2-Youth Hands in Hands youth workers, expert-and decision-makers meeting" is the second activity of Youth Hands in Hands for Combating Drug and Substance Abuse which is organised under Erasmus+ Structured Dialogue. The first transitional activity of the project "A2-Youth Hands in Hands youth workers, expert and decision-makers meeting" will be held on 15-18 October 2018 in Frankfurt, Germany. This activity will be hosted by Intercultural Club- Goethe Uni.

Youth workers, experts and decision-makers will come together at Goethe University, Frankfurt, Germany. Each partner will send two representatives for this activity. The project outline will be highlighted once more in details and partners will get to know each other to develop capacity and cooperation among the partner organisations to fight against drug and substance abuse.

Each partner will present their NGOs and activities related to drug and substance abuse. Good practices in of each country will be shared by partners. This activity contains visiting the public institution and meeting with decision-makers, planning and discussion of third activities, and discussion on dissemination strategy of the project.

Working Methodology

The program activities will focus on non-formal learning, learning- by-sharing method and intercultural dialogue. The youth workers will have a chance to meet experts and decision makers to discuss project themes. In order to achieve the learning objectives, a variety of interactive working methods such as workshops, good practice sharing, study visits and plenary discussions will be used, according to the specific learning needs of the participants and their organisations.

Participant Profile

Youth workers, volunteers, experts and governmental officers who are engaged in project theme. Participants are required to have an experience working with young people who are under risk of drug abuse in the local community and wide knowledge on preventing drug and substance consumption. There will be participants from Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Rep., Estonia, Germany, Italy, Portugal, Netherlands and Turkey. Each partner organisation will be represented by 2 participants. Please ensure gender equality (1+1). The working language will be in English.

Meetings: All the sessions and meetings will take place in Goethe University.

Meals: The participants will have two meals per day, lunch box and two coffee breaks.

Travel Arrangements

The food and accommodation will be provided and paid by the coordinator organisation Beyoğlu District National Education Directorate, with the financial support of the Erasmus+ Programme, the European Commission.
