Invoice (NOTE that NO electronic tickets will be reimbursed if the original invoice will not be provided!) 3. Travel reimbursement form (will be provided on the arrival) 4. RULES OF REIMBURSEMENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - up to 30 days after we receive original documents by post + answered questionnaire from group leaders we transfer 100 % of travel costs. - Each group leader will be obligated to answer the questionnaire of the EACEA. This is the basic for reporting and also getting funds. <p>We reimbursed only through bank transfer.</p>
TRAVEL INFO	<p>EASIEST CONNECTION:</p> <p>If you travel by plane, the nearest airport is Ljubljana airport: http://www.lju-airport.si/eng</p> <p>From here you take bus or shuttle to get to Ljubljana train station:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - shuttle (direct to Celje): https://www.goopti.com/en/ (we recommend it as it is cheap and direct from airport) - bus (from airport to Ljubljana train station): http://www.lju-airport.si/en/passengers-and-visitors/getting-here/bus/ <p>Bus costs for one way: 4,10 € (approx). And it takes around 45 minutes to arrive to the Train station Ljubljana.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - shuttle from airport to train station Ljubljana: Shuttle costs for one way: 9 €. <p>And it takes around 30 minutes to arrive to the train station Ljubljana.</p> <p>For shuttle you have to inform them, that you will use their service here: http://www.mnj.si/</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - From Ljubljana train station to Celje train station: http://www.slo-zeleznice.si/en/ <p>(Prices for each connection are different. Please check the details for further info about changes of the trains.)</p> <p>From Celje train station to the venue of the youth exchange is 3 minutes walk.</p> <p>Other possible and also cheaper airports: Zagreb, Venice, Trieste, Graz, Vienna.</p> <p>If you use those airports arrange shuttle to the nearest place possible with Goopti (https://www.goopti.com/en/) and then use train to Celje if there is no direct connections to Celje.</p>

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE PROJECT	<p>Changing views is a youth exchange project that involves 35 young from Slovenia, Italy, Croatia, Romania and Czech Republic. Exchange will take place in Celje youth center between 20.8.2016 and 27.8.2016. Motivation for implementation of this project arises from observation of peers intolerance towards refugees, migrants, as well as evaluation and assessment of people of different cultures through stereotypic idea and with this project we want to expand the importance of tolerance in society, strengthen intercultural dialogue, establish cooperation between young and to promote awareness of consequences of stereotypical thinking on social exclusion. With the implementation of various workshops, lectures, and group work we will "break" stereotypes associated with refugees, different cultures, religion and gender, discuss media coverage of refugee/migrant crisis and its impact on young people, learn about ways of media reporting and channels of communication, prepare an exhibition of photographs and publish a newspaper, which are also the main results of the project. Participants will be informally educated through active participation, acquire and develop key competences throughout the project, strengthen awareness and respect of cultural diversity and include media and local community in the project.</p>
