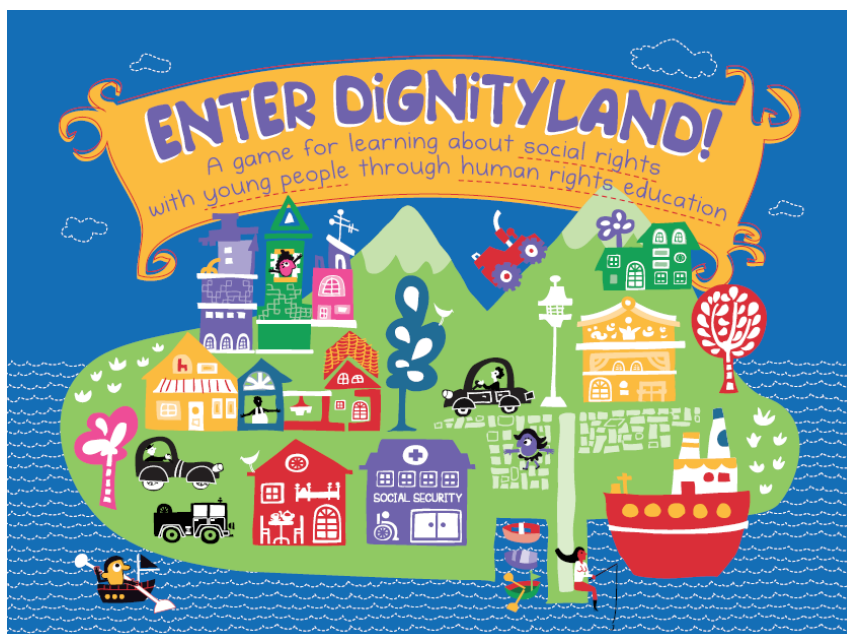

Description:

The term *Social Rights* has become a buzz word lately. Everyone speaks about it, but no one really knows what does it mean and people keep asking: Is it just about human rights? Is that rights from European Union or not? What does it includes? How can put it to our projects? How can we make it concrete and practical to act in my community?

Enter Dignityland is a youth exchange, which was developed as tool to help young people to understand the concept of social rights, notice the violence of it and help those in need. Have the European Social Charter as base and background; we will approach the idea of Social Rights in different levels: Housing, Education, Health, Employment, Non-Discrimination, Legal and Social Protection and Movement of Persons. We will work and share on case, examples and community in practice. Together, we will be working on improving the “good examples” on how to motivate youngsters aware and active on their community and beyond.

Aim:

When Social Meet Rights is a youth exchange that aims to empower young people to get to know social rights and help those in need.

Objectives:

- To increase the awareness of the European Social Charter and its practical implementation among young people;

- to address situations of conflict and exclusion of young people living in multicultural environments through non-formal education, role play and simulations games;
- to develop conceptual and practical means of translating social rights into the realities of young people;
- to explore and identify means for innovative youth based actions with young people at risk of exclusion and violence;
- to initiate, support and evaluate up to five innovative local actions and events with a high multiplier effect across partner countries to raise awareness on the European Social Charter;

Target group:

- Young people that are living in disadvantage neighborhoods;
- Young people with no knowledge on their social rights;
- Young people with interest in intercultural learning;
- Young people who are interested in activism;
- Participants that have an active attitude!
- Aged 18 – 25 (no limit for group leader)

Time plan and venue:

APV: **7th - 10th February 2020**

Date of the exchange: **28th April (Arrival Day) – 06th May (Departure Day) 2020**

Venue: **Viljandi, Estonia** (specific venue will be clarified during next months)

Group and duration:

The group will consist of 32 participants from 5 countries, and 5 youth leaders.

Duration will be **9 days (travel days included)**

Financial aspects

Accommodation and lodging covered by 100% by the Erasmus +

Travel expenses partially covered by Erasmus + (the amount depends of the route to the venue of the exchange)

Participation fee: 25 euros.

Dates:

7th -10th February 2019 (including travel days)

Accommodation:

APV will take place in Viljandi, South Estonia. We will be staying in an Airbnb in the city.

Accommodation and food are covered 100% by Erasmus +

Transport:
