- ❖to develop a shared understanding of youth participation online and analyze the achievements and pitfalls of current youth participation in these processes;
- ❖to explore what are the rights, the means, the spaces, the opportunities and the support required by young people in order to meaningfully participate in the shaping of the Internet;
- ❖to engage young people online and develop their capacity and competences in active participation in the life of community;
- ❖to create opportunities for participation of young people with disadvantages through the online space;
- ❖to equip youth workers with different tools and practices of involving youth to active participation online;
- ❖to build capacities of youth organizations through sharing and exploring the tools of engaging youth to active participation in democratic life through online participation and activism.

- ✓ To keep all documents related to travel.
- ✓ To prepare for the activities, do local activities and disseminate (share) the project result with other people.
- ✓ To attend in the all sessions of the project activity

- ✓ Ensure gender balance, 1 or 2 participants with fewer opportunities.
- ✓ Assist travel arrangements.

- ✓ Ensure the visibility of the project in their local and region.

PARTICIPANTS SHOULD DO



- ✓ To search and inform project coordinator about travel tickets and buy them **AFTER GETTING CONFIRMATION** from them.
- ✓ To inform the hosting organization about the time of arrival and ensure attendance to all sessions of the project activity.
- ✓ Obtain the health insurance. It is mandatory to arrange one in advance before coming to the project.

- Reimbursement will be done in Euros, regardless of the currency indicated on the ticket and receipt/invoice.
- **The accommodation and food, as well as travels included (if any) in the programme, will be fully covered, although, we kindly ask you to bring money if you wish to spend on other things for your own goods during the project**
- Participants contribution will be given during the project.



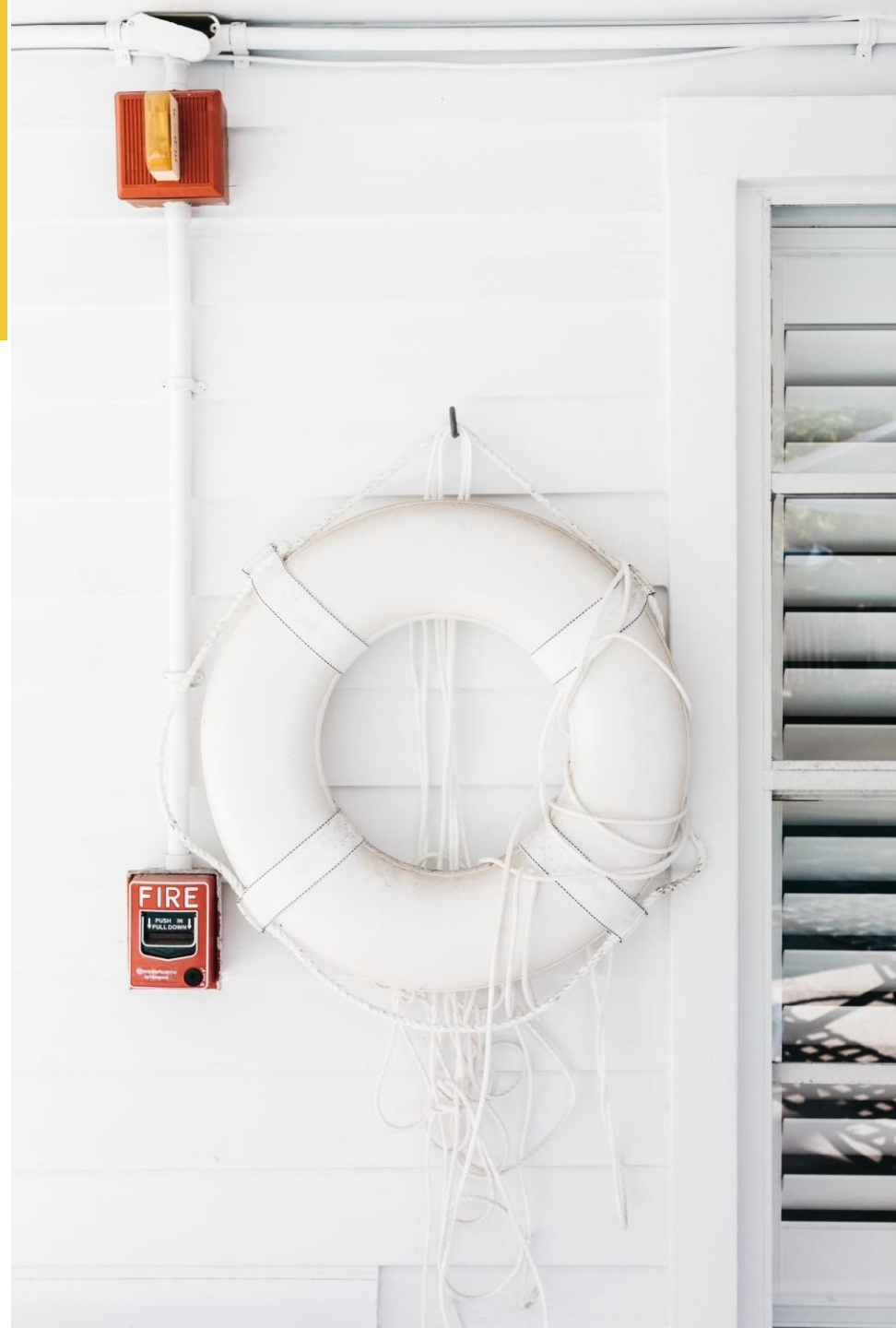
HEALTH INSURANCE
